Springtime trifecta of flowering trees is a sure bet for all-season beauty

Bet on flowering trees to bring beauty and joy to the spring landscape. Not to mention pollinators! A weeping cherry, a columnar hybrid flowering pear, and a dazzling redbud are among the first of flowering trees to bloom in spring. Beyond bloom time, each has unique characteristics that bring multi-season interest to the landscape.

Pink Cascade® Cherry looks great throughout the summer months, thanks to its dark green, clean, disease-resistant, heat-tolerant foliage. When autumn rolls around, this weeping tree delivers bright and bold orange fall color.



Pink Cascade® Cherry presents a fragrant cascade of bright pink, bell-shaped flowers that smother its gracefully weeping branches in spring. Reminiscent in form and foliage of the popular white-blooming Snow Fountains® Cherry, this new introduction features dark green, heat-tolerant, disease-resistant foliage that turns bright orange-red in autumn. Growers will appreciate its vigor and ease of care as it matures to a height and spread of approximately 12' x 12'.

Javelin® Pear also lights up the fall landscape when its glossy dark green leaves deepen to rich maroon-purple in autumn. Its tightly columnar canopy serves as a landscape exclamation point or a visual screen when planted in groups or a row.

The Rising Sun Redbud is lovely in flower and absolutely swoon-worthy from the time its leaves emerge until they flutter to the ground in autumn. Leaves emerge apricot-orange and mature to golden-orange and various shade of lime to medium green. Summer's new growth stands out in bright contrast to the more mature leaves, delivering a season-long show of color.



The Rising Sun Redbud announces spring with rosy-orchid flowers borne in dense clusters along its branches. These give way to glossy, heart-shaped foliage that emerges apricot-orange before turning golden yellow to golden orange as the heat of summer intensifies. Drought and heat resistance prevents leaves from burning. Distinctive zigzag growth pattern and smooth, tan bark add winter interest to this striking new Redbud. Mature size is approximately 12' tall x 8' wide.

Javelin® Pear greets spring with dense clusters of pink-tinged white blooms that cover its tightly columnar canopy in spring. Leaves soon emerge maroon-purple and gradually mature to glossy dark green. Insect and disease-resistant foliage stays fresh through the heat of summer and turns purple to maroon in autumn. Urban adaptability and superior fireblight resistance are attributes of this promising street tree.
