Fall into pink

Chilly mornings and the turning of leaves from green to bright tones of orange, red and yellow are sure signs that it's time to think pink when choosing landscape trees for outstanding fall color. Flowering cherries are known and loved for their bright spring blooms, but are underappreciated for their beautiful autumn tones.

Bright fall color is a common denominator of these outstanding flowering cherries. Decidedly different in form, leaf shape and landscape function, the three cultivars deliver beauty through the seasons; bright pink spring flowers, deep green, disease-resistant summer foliage, bright, long-lasting fall color, and structural character that lends winter interest.



Pink Cascade

A fragrant cascade of bright pink, bell-shaped flowers drape the branches of Pink Cascade® Cherry in spring. Reminiscent in form and foliage of the popular white-blooming Snow Fountains® Cherry, this new weeping tree features dark green, heat-tolerant, disease-resistant foliage that turns bright orange-red in autumn. Growers will appreciate its vigor and ease of care as it matures to a height and spread of approximately 12' x 12'.

First Blush
Flowering Cherry

Bright, double pink flowers smother the slender branches of this very narrow, upright cherry in early spring. The breathtaking floral display gives way to dark green, finely textured, disease resistant leaves that present a cool, narrow column of shade throughout the summer months. Foliage turns bright orange to orange-red in autumn, presenting a colorful, long-lasting medley of orange, red and golden-orange tones. Mature height and spread is approximately 25' x 12'.

Pink Flair
Flowering Cherry

Big clusters of fragrant, bright pink single blooms herald the arrival of spring, a week or two later than is typical of the species, thus avoiding frost damage. Exceptionally healthy, deep green foliage stays clean and fresh through the summer months. Superior cold hardiness (Zone 3B), heat and drought tolerance, and bright orange-red fall color even in Southern climates recommend it as an all-season tree for garden, park and street use across a wide range of climate zone.
