

Blaze new trails with a pair of outstanding sugar maples

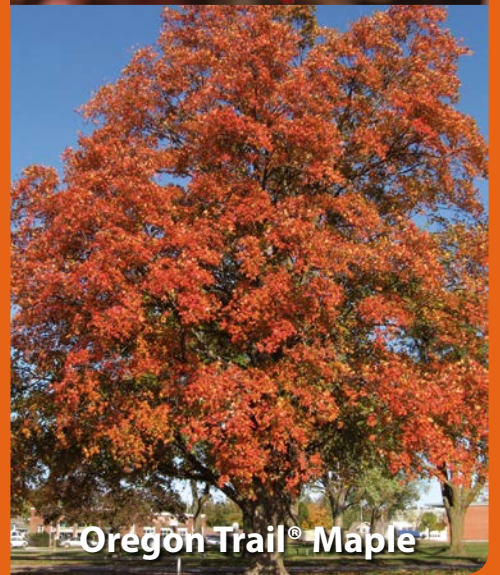


Flashfire® Maple (*Acer saccharum* 'JFS-Caddo2') is our top pick from trees grown from seed collected from an isolated population of sugar maples growing in Caddo County, Oklahoma. This strain of heat-adapted sugar maples has evolved in rocky, arid, limestone soils. Flashfire® is well adapted to dry, hot weather and possesses the cold hardiness needed to survive the harsh, windswept winters on the Great Plains. More mildew resistant than other Caddo selections, it is adapted to Southern heat and humidity. It has performed well and colored very well in central Georgia.

Oregon Trail® Maple (*Acer saccharum* 'Hiawatha 1') is the most colorful and best loved of hundreds of brightly colored sugar maples that grow in Hiawatha, Kansas, "The City of Beautiful Maples. Hiawatha citizens voted it their favorite of this unique collection of sugar maples that grow alongside the Oregon Trail. This Kansas native tree is drought and heat resistant, with strong branch angles and sturdy limbs that resist ice damage.
